

A Look Back at 29 Years as an Open Access Publisher

Introduction

Imagine the Internet without the Web. Imagine that there is no Google or similar search engine. Imagine that the cutting edge Internet applications are e-mail, LISTSERV, FTP, and Telnet. Imagine that the Internet is made up of a number of different noncommercial networks, and that the connections between them are not always transparent. Imagine that Microsoft only shipped one million copies of the second version of Windows last year, and you are using MS-DOS without a graphical interface instead. Imagine that no established publisher has even experimented with an e-journal. Imagine that the latest mid-range PC has a 6 MHz 16/32-bit 80386SX processor, a 30 MB hard drive, and 2 MB of RAM and costs about \$3,900.

That was the situation in June 1989 when I launched PACS-L, a LISTSERV mailing list. PACS-L was one of the first library-oriented mailing lists, and it was unusual in that it had a broad subject focus (public-access computer systems in libraries). Although PACS-L's greatest contribution may have been in raising librarians' awareness of the importance and potential of the then fledgling Internet, it was also the platform on which my initial scholarly digital publishing efforts were based.

In August 1989, I launched *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, one of the first e-journals on the Internet and the first open access journal in the field of library and information science. It was freely available, allowed authors to retain their copyrights, and had special copyright provisions for noncommercial use. Issues were announced via e-mail, and articles were distributed as ASCII files from a LISTSERV.

Starting in 1994, ASCII articles were also distributed via a Gopher server. In 1995, a website was established, and articles were also distributed as HTML files.

I edited the *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review* through 1996. By the end of that year, there had been over 4.2 million requests for the journal's files.

In 1996, I established the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography*, an open access e-book that had 79 subsequent versions. It was initially published in the HTML, PDF, and Word formats.

These early digital publishing projects were sponsored by the University of Houston Libraries, which maintains an archive of ASCII articles from *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review* (<http://journals.tdl.org/pacsr/index.php/pacsr>). The Internet Archive includes copies of the entire journal website, including the HTML versions of the articles:

All three of these digital publishing ventures were authorized and supported by Robin N. Downes, the visionary Director of the University of Houston Libraries.

In 2005, I established Digital Scholarship (<http://digital-scholarship.org/>), and I began to publish open access works under Creative Commons licenses. Since then, Digital Scholarship has published PDF books, inexpensive paperback books, XHTML bibliographies, weblogs, Twitter streams, and other works.

The last version of the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography* was published in 2011 (<http://digital-scholarship.org/sep/sep.html>). From 1996 through 2011, the e-book had over 11.9 million file requests.

From April 2005 through May 2018, Digital Scholarship had over 19.4 million visitors from 240 Internet country domains, over 93.3 million file requests, and over 69.7 million page views. Excluding spiders, there were over 11.6 million visitors from 240 Internet country domains, over 53.7 million file requests, and over 31.6 million page views.

Chronology

Below is a brief chronology of my digital publishing efforts from June 1989 through May 2018.

1989

- June 29, 1989. Established the PACS-L LISTSERV mailing list, acted as list owner and, later, as its first moderator.
- August 16, 1989. Established *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review* (*PACS Review*, also known as *PACS-R*).

1990

- 1990. Published 3 issues of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, including the one described below.
- January 3, 1990. Published the first issue of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*. Articles were selected by the editors. They were distributed as ASCII files using the LISTSERV software; table of contents messages were e-mailed to subscribers.
- March 5, 1990. Established and acted as co-editor with Dana C. Rooks of *Public-Access Computer Systems News*, a free electronic newsletter. Acted as co-editor until the end of 1992. Published 12 issues in 1990. *The Public-Access Computer Systems News* was published by the University of Houston Libraries.
- August 30, 1990. Published the first version of "Library-Oriented BITNET Lists," a directory of mailing lists. Published 3 versions in 1990.

1991

- 1991. Published 2 issues of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, including those described below.
- 1991. Published 11 issues of *Public-Access Computer Systems News*.
- Published 8 versions of "Library-Oriented Computer Conferences and Electronic Serials."
- August 26, 1991. Published the volume 2, no. 1 issue of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*. This was a special issue on open access journals, such as *Postmodern Culture* and *Psycology*.
- October 29, 1991. Published the volume 2, no. 2 issue of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*. Adopted a more flexible *PACS Review* publication schedule that took advantage of electronic publishing capabilities and reduced article publication time.
- November 11, 1991. Changed *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review* to a peer-reviewed journal.
- November 15, 1991. Announced that I was stepping down as PACS-L moderator. PACS-L had over 3,100 subscribers at the time.

1992

- 1992. Published 8 issues of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*.
- 1992. Published 16 issues of *Public-Access Computer Systems News*.
- 1992. Published 9 versions of "Library-Oriented Computer Conferences and Electronic Serials."
- 1992. *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, Volume 1, 1990 was published as a paperback by the Library and Information Technology Association. Walt Crawford formatted a digital copy of the book as camera-ready copy for LITA at no cost (he did this for subsequent print versions as well). Printed annual versions were published at the recommendation of the journal's editorial board, which was concerned with the problem of limited Internet access by some readers during this early period.
- 1992. *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, Volume 2, 1991 was published as a paperback by the Library and Information Technology Association.
- January 13, 1992. Established the PACS-P mailing list to distribute the University of Houston Libraries electronic publications and *Current Cites*.

1993

- 1993. Published 6 issues of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*.
- 1993. Published 4 versions of "Library-Oriented Lists and Electronic Serials."
- 1993. *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, Volume 3, 1992 was published as a paperback by the Library and Information Technology Association.

1994

- 1994. Published 7 issues of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*.
- 1994. *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, Volume 4, 1993 was published as a paperback by the Library and Information Technology Association.
- January 18, 1994. Published my last version of "Library-Oriented Lists and Electronic Serials." Subsequently, Ann Thornton and Steve Bonario maintained the document, then Wei Wu maintained it as a searchable Web site until 2006.
- January 29, 1994. Made *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review* and *Public-Access Computer Systems News* available via a Gopher server.

1995

- 1995. Published 5 issues of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, including the one described below.
- 1995. *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, Volume 5, 1994 was published as a paperback by the Library and Information Technology Association.

- 1995. *Research and Development of Scholarly Information Dissemination Systems: Report for the Fiscal Year 1994, a Grant-in-Aid Research by the Ministry of Education, Science and Culture, Japan for the Year 1994/95* (06302076). Papers from *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review* were translated into Japanese and published as a paperback by the National Institute of Informatics.
- March 21, 1995. Published the volume 6, no. 1 issue of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*, the first HTML version of the journal. Established a policy that allowed authors to update articles. This issue was composed of the first version of my "Network-Based Electronic Publishing of Scholarly Works: A Selective Bibliography." Fourteen versions were published in 1995.

1996

- 1996. Published 6 issues of *The Public-Access Computer Systems Review*.
- 1996. Published 3 versions of the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography*, including the ones described below.

- September 12, 1996. Announced that I was stepping down as *PACS Review* Editor-in-Chief at the end of 1996.
- October 25, 1996. Published the first version of the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography (SEPB)*, an open access, updated electronic book that provided references to new works related to scholarly electronic publishing, such as books, journal articles, magazine articles, technical reports, and white papers. The HTML bibliography was searchable.
- November 15, 1996. Published version 2 of the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography*, adding a Word file version.
- December 17, 1996. Published version 3 of the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography*, adding a PDF file version.

1997

- 1997. Published 11 versions of the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography*, including the one described below.
- September 16, 1997. Published version 12 of the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography*. Included the first version of *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Resources*.

1998

- 1998. Published 8 versions of the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography*.

1999

- 1999. Published 6 versions of the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography*.

Established Digital Scholarship, a digital press that publishes works about digital copyright, digital curation, digital repository, open access, scholarly communication, and other digital information issues. Digital Scholarship publications, including paperbacks, are under Creative Commons licenses. (Until January 2006, the site was called Escholarlypub.)
- April 20, 2005. Established *DigitalKoans*, a weblog that covers the same topics as Digital Scholarship.
- August 10, 2005. Made a preprint of the "Open Access Webliography" available (coauthored with Adrian K. Ho).
- July 8, 2005. Published the first version of the *Electronic Theses and Dissertations Bibliography*.
- October 25, 2005. Published the first version of the *Google Book Search Bibliography*.

- November 3, 2006. Migrated the *Scholarly Electronic Publishing Bibliography* from the University of Houston Libraries' servers to escholarlypub.com.
